RESOLUTION TO ALLOW ALL OKLAHOMA LEGISLATORS TO REPRESENT THEIR CONSTITUENTS

*Sponsored by Nathan Voelkers, Kay County Precinct 503
Adopted by the Kay County Republican Party Convention, March 2, 2024*

Whereas, The “Rules” of the legislature make it practically impossible, especially for newly elected legislators, to represent their constituents in any meaningful way; and every citizen deserves to be represented to the best of his legislator’s ability;

Whereas, The Leadership of each legislative body (Senate Pro Tem and Speaker of the House) appoints committee Chairs, and determines who the committee members are;

Whereas, The Leadership sets the agenda of each legislative body, including which bills will be assigned to committees, and which bills will be heard on the floor before the entire body;

Whereas, Those appointed to chair a committee also have the power to deny a bill a hearing and a vote before the committee or not; and have the power to request or require changes to a bill, effectively bypassing the purpose of the committee and representative government;

Whereas, The Speaker of the House, the Pro Tem of the Senate, and the individual committee Chairmen who are appointed by the Leadership, become, in effect, “super” legislators, capable of suppressing or promoting any legislation they choose;

Whereas, Given the practical effect of the “Rules” of the legislature is that any bill can be killed by the power of these few “super” legislators, without a hearing or a vote, either in committee or on the floor of the legislative body before all the members;

Whereas, The Leadership, by selecting loyal committee Chairmen and arranging membership of committees, can manipulate the entire legislative agenda, killing bills they do not want heard, and pressuring legislators to vote a certain way on bills they want passed;

Whereas, Since the quickest way to gain influence at the Oklahoma state legislature is to support the Leadership's agenda, many legislators will compromise a little, or a lot, in order to gain favor so that their own bills can be heard;

Whereas, An array of excuses are made so that any legislator's bills may not be heard (lack of time, calendar is too full, every bill will have to be heard, there is a discharge petition); now, therefore, be it

Resolved by the Kay County Republican Party in convention assembled, That the Oklahoma House and the Oklahoma Senate adopt a new Rule that: at the bill authors' request, there shall be an opportunity for at least a small number of their bills to be heard and receive a vote in committee, and having passed committee, shall have an opportunity to be heard and receive a vote on the House or Senate Floor. Furthermore, to ensure an Open Government in Oklahoma in perpetuity, an amendment to the state Constitution to accomplish the same is the best remedy.

RESOLUTION TO ALLOW ALL OKLAHOMA LEGISLATORS TO REPRESENT THEIR CONSTITUENTS

*Sponsored by Nathan Voelkers, Kay County Precinct 503
Adopted by the Kay County Republican Party Convention, March 2, 2024*

Whereas, Democrat State Senator Michael Brooks has introduced a Bill in the Oklahoma State Senate to allow Driver's Licenses to be granted to persons illegally entering the United States; and

Whereas, Senator Bill Coleman and Representative Ken Luttrell have publicly expressed support for this bill and voted for similar bills previously; and

Whereas, This bill would not only damage the integrity of Oklahoma Law concerning vehicle operation on our highways, but would damage the integrity of elections in Oklahoma; and

Whereas, The Kay County Republican Party honors our Rule of Law, the Oklahoma State GOP platform, and believes that no one should be rewarded with privileges when they have broken laws to gain their position; and

Whereas, Current policies of the United States Federal Government are directed by an Administration that is allowing thousands of illegal incursions from countries around the globe on our southern border daily, many of whom subsequently travel into Oklahoma; and

Whereas, Current Oklahoma Election Law states that the only recourse for voter fraud by the Election Board Secretary is to pass the complainant onto a local District Attorney for the first and final decision on investigation and prosecution (Oklahoma Title 26 section 26. 16. 105); and

Whereas, Oklahoma currently has multiple liberal District Attorneys who may be in favor of an open border, lax election laws, and lax driver licensing in the District they control; raising concerns of "sanctuary city" support, and in other cases limited budgetary funding can impact ability to prosecute; and

Whereas, Massive additional loopholes exist in these proposed laws since they direct the Election Board Secretary, because laws are not in place to require the retaining of information for future comparison of records, to determine if applicants for voter registration have previously received a non-citizen driver license; and

Whereas, The Oklahoma Republican Party Platform states on Page 1, under “As Republicans, we believe: In welcoming immigrants, who want to legally seek freedom and opportunity, who want to work and who will embrace our values, learn the English language and respect our Union’s border and State’s sovereignty” and, additionally, on Page #25, Section III Government (D) National Issues iii Issues Immigration, We Support, Item #10 states, “We support issuing driver’s licenses only to citizens and others who reside here legally, and not to illegal aliens”; now, therefore, be it,

Resolved by the Kay County Republican Party assembled in convention, That we unanimously oppose any efforts that allow driver’s licenses for illegal non-citizens. The Kay County GOP shall send a copy of this Resolution to direct Senator Bill Coleman, Senator Roland Pederson, Senator Greg Treat (President Pro Tempore), Rep. Charles McCall (Speaker of the House), and Representatives Ken Luttrell and John Pfeiffer and the OKGOP to stand against this or similar legislation.

Whereas, Children are a gift from God to their parents who hold the ultimate authority to direct and oversee the education, training, healthcare, religious views, emotional and psychological well-being of their children - Parents do not co-parent with government;

Whereas, The Biden Administration states, “Community schools meet the unique needs of the neighborhoods they serve by leveraging local non-profit, private sector, and public partnerships to bring wraparound services into school buildings, such as mental health supports, dental services, and assistance with shelter and nutrition;”

Whereas, The Whole School, Whole Community, Whole Child Community Schools model is the CDC’s framework for addressing health in schools by bringing community health agencies, nurses, dentists and mental health professionals into the school community;

Whereas, The NEA (National Education Association), the nation’s leading advocate for training in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI), is promoting legislation in all 50 states to incorporate Community Schools nationwide as part of the public education model;

Whereas, Members of the Oklahoma Legislature have proposed legislation to institute Community Schools into public education across Oklahoma;

Whereas, The Oklahoma Republican Platform states:

- “We believe to comply with the Tenth Amendment of the U.S. Constitution, we favor elimination and complete defunding of the Federal Department of Education.”
- “We oppose public-private partnerships.”
- “We believe the responsibility to teach children the philosophy, values, and theology to live by belongs to a child’s parents.”
- “We oppose mandatory healthcare in public schools including mandatory vaccinations for students, and any forced mental health evaluations or prescriptions.”
